

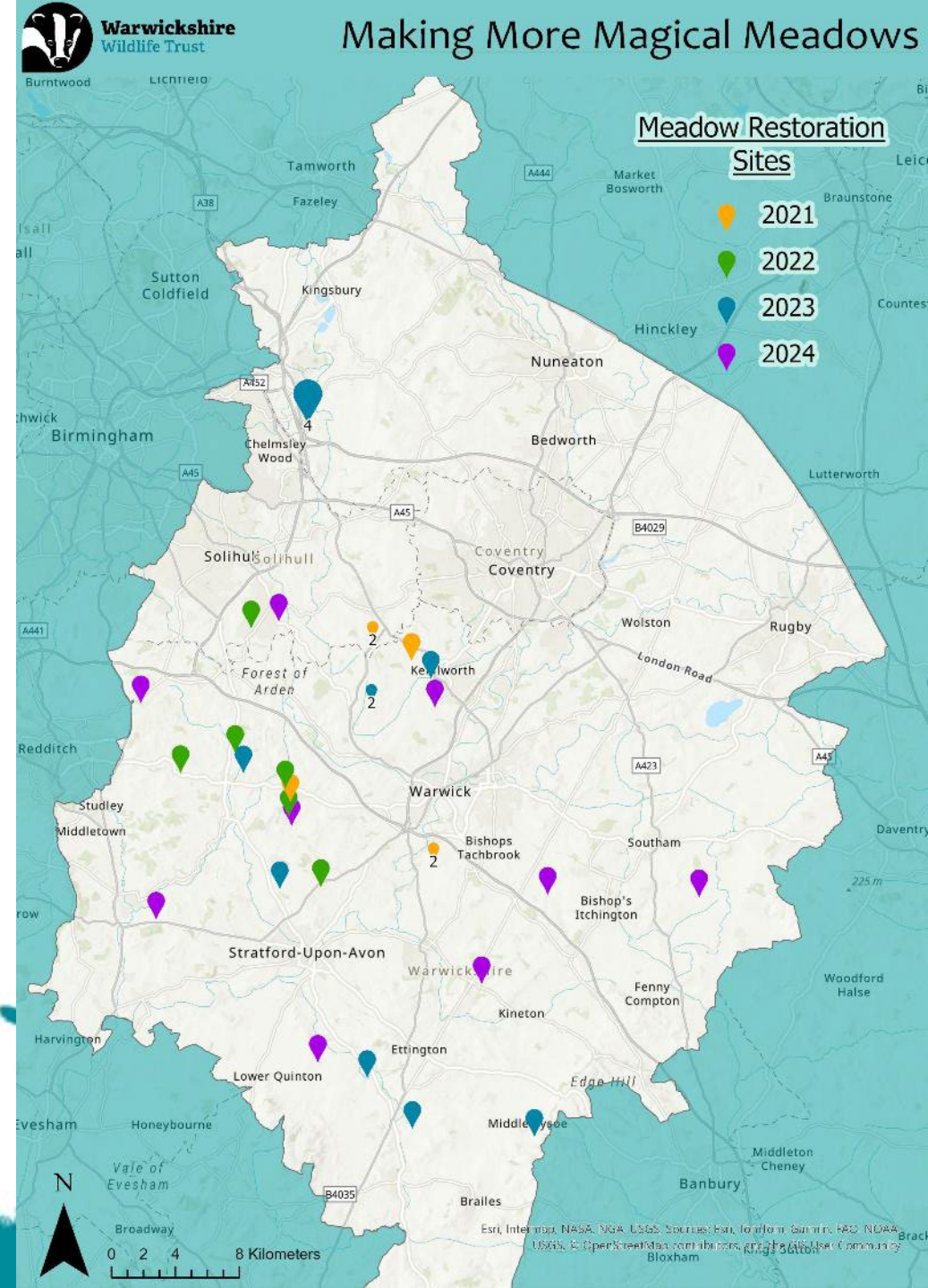
# Warwickshire Meadows Hub

# Why set up a meadows hub?

- Making More Magical Meadows Project reseeded 88ha of wildflower meadows over 4 years.
- Wanted to continue building on knowledge and sharing it with others.
- Wanted to bring together everyone working towards similar goals.



# Aims

## Strategic Coordination

Align initiatives to avoid duplication and maximise ecological benefits, in coordination with the LNRS.

## Collate resources

Create a shared database of local seed sources, sources of green hay and contractors for use in meadow restoration and management.

## Knowledge Exchange

Facilitate sharing of best practice, research, and practical experience in meadow creation, restoration, and management.

## Funding

Identify and pursue funding opportunities, resources, and partnerships to support meadow restoration projects.

## Monitoring and evidence

Promote surveying, monitoring and evaluation of restoration and management techniques to evidence and inform best practice.

## Advocacy and Engagement

Raise awareness of the value of meadows and engage communities, landowners, and decision-makers in their protection and enhancement.

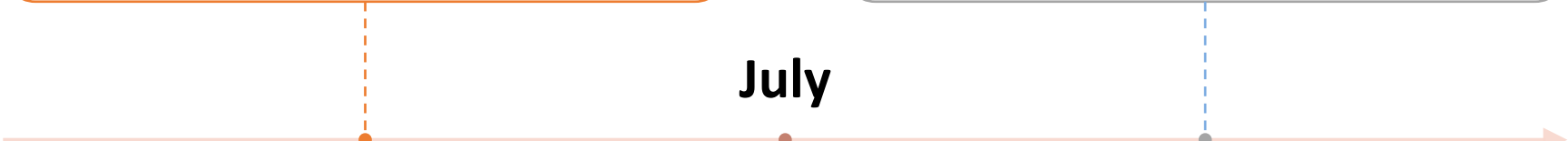
